She worked in the travel business for several years and then, due to being made redundant from work, she decided to pursue her other passion in life, the human mind and its potential. She trained in neuro-linguistic programming (NLP) and investigated several alternative therapies including reiki, shiatsu, Aura-Soma, The Demartini Method, macrobiotics, do-in, aromatherapy, reflexology, hypnotherapy, Time Line Therapy, The Journey, and The Work of Byron Katie, which all gave her a better and holistic understanding of the human being that we all are. In 2008 Gabriella joined a group of people going to Antarctica to face their fears and limiting beliefs - to test herself and put into action first hand and in a dramatic way what she learnt, and then pass it on to others.
