This haggadah explores themes of nature and the land within the Passover seder, to help participants develop an ecological understanding of and connection with Jewish tradition. Passover marks the Jewish peoples' liberation from slavery in Egypt and the coming of spring. Yet it is also a story about land and the natural world. All our biblical holidays"–, –"Passover included"–, –"originally commemorated the agrarian and pastoral soil out of which Judaism grew. Today, we are deeply aware that our well-being and our freedom ultimately depend on the earth's well-being. If the earth and its systems are compromised, our ability to be free is compromised; life is compromised. This haggadah keeps the earth in the forefront of our minds. It seeks to reveal the seder's ecological dimensions and awaken its environmental meaning.

Sammy Spider's First Rosh Hashanah

Humanity is a part of Nature, yet every thinking person at one time or another asks herself or himself, "How did we get here? What makes me different from the rest of Nature?" In *The Course of Nature* an artist and a scientist ask those questions with full respect for all contexts, both scientific and not. Richard Codor's Joyous Haggadah

Despite its deceptively simple title, this book ponders the thorny issue of the place of the Bible in Jewish religion and culture. By thoroughly examining the complex link that the Jews have formed with the Bible, Jewish scholar Jean-Christophe Attias raises the uncomfortable question of whether it is still relevant for them. Jews and the Bible reveals how the Jews define themselves in various times and places with the Bible, without the Bible, and against the Bible. Is it divine revelation or national myth? Literature or legislative code? One book or a disparate library? Text or object? For the Jews, over the past two thousand years or more, the Bible has been all that and much more. In fact, Attias argues that the Bible is nothing in and of itself. Like the Koran, the Bible has never been anything other than what its readers make of it. But what they've made of it tells a fascinating story and raises provocative philosophical and ethical questions. The Bible is indeed an elusive book, and so Attias explores the fundamental discrepancy between what we think the Bible tells us about Judaism and what Judaism actually tells us about the Bible. With passion and intellect, Attias informs and enlightens the reader, never shying away from the difficult questions, ultimately asking: In our post-genocide and post-Zionist culture, can the Bible be saved?

From her religious upbringing and familiarity with the Torah and its commentary, to her visual engagement with Rabbi Akiva, Moses, Miriam and Elijah the Prophet, Emily's knowledge and deep understanding of her subject is clear. Nearly every pair of pages is adorned with an original analog collage. Beautifully designed by Rachel Jackson, the Haggadah is a pleasure to use because of the carefully chosen palette and easy to read fonts. Emily Marbach's new English translation of the complete Hebrew text uses inclusive language leaving Hashem gender neutral as well as the anonymous angels and seraphs. The foremothers are mentioned not only in the song "Who Knows One?" But besides that, the translation endeavors to

deliver the words without the antiquated baggage of "thees and thous" to enable the participant to clearly see what the text is trying to convey. A collaged collection of commentaries are dotted around, available to anyone who hasn't done their homework but wants to make a remark or open a parallel discussion. The Collage Haggadah not only serves a ritualistic purpose, it can fulfill an artistic need as well. It is an artist's journey of one of the oldest expeditions ever recorded. It is a collection of collages on a series of related themes that make up a cohesive exhibition. Let this Haggadah begin your gathering, add to your stack or complete your collection. Let's hope that we can all have a plague-free Passover this year and in years to come.
